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Confirmed case of COVID-19 in the school

11th November 2020

Dear Parent/Carer,

We have been advised by Public Health England that there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the school.

The confirmed case is an adult in Y6 and Y3 at Woodpecker Hall Academy.

As your child is in Y6 or Y3 and in the same year group bubble as the infected adult, in line with national guidance, your child must now **stay at home and self-isolate** until **Wednesday 25th November.** You must not bring them into school. Your last day of self-isolation is **Wednesday 25th November**. Your first day back at school is **Thursday 26th November**. November.

If your child is well at the end of the 14 day period of self-isolation, then they can return to usual activities, including school. Other members of your household can continue their normal activities provided your child does not develop symptoms within the 14-day self-isolation period.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 14 days.

The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas. Household members staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection that they can pass on to others in the community.

If you are able, isolate from vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) living in your home, please do so during your isolation period.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

Home Learning Children in Y3 and Y6

For the next 14 days your child's teacher will be working from home too. Your child will be expected to continue to learn from home every day.

Your child's learning will be posted onto DB primary daily. The class teacher will be monitoring the work online and will get in touch with your child by phone or Zoom at least twice a week for a progress catch up. Please see the attached timetable for home-learning.
