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Confirmed case of COVID-19

Dear Parent/Carer,

We have been advised by Public Health England that there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 within the school.

The confirmed case is an adult in Reception: Hazel class

As your child has been in close contact with the infected adult, in line with national guidance, your child must now stay at home and self-isolate until Wednesday 23rd December. Their last day of self-isolation is Wednesday 23rd December. Children will be able to go out from Thursday 24th December.

If your child is well at the end of the 10-day period of self-isolation, then they can return to usual activities, including school. Other members of your household can continue their normal activities provided your child does not develop symptoms within the 10-day self-isolation period. Please see the link to the PHE Staying at Home Guidance here.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days.

The 10-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. Household members should not go to work, school or public areas. Household members staying at home for 10 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection that they can pass on to others in the community.

If you are able, isolate from vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) living in your home, please do so during your isolation period.

Symptoms of COVID 19

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).
