Welcome Back - Academic Year 2021-2022

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to a new school year. I hope you have had a lovely summer break and have enjoyed time with your children, family and friends. We are looking forward to a year where school-life returns to some sort of normal for us all.

As Covid-19 restrictions have lifted across England, it's important that we inform you of the measures and procedures that are in place for our school reopening on Monday 6th September 2021.

Covid-19 Changes

Following Government guidelines there will be changes to our risk assessment and school procedures which reflect the lifting of restrictions.

From September 6th the following changes will take place:

- Children will no longer be in group bubbles
- Children identified as a close contact can return to school whilst waiting for a PCR result
- Educational visits return
- No one-way systems
- Parents are only informed of a positive Covid-19 test if the school has an outbreak

Covid-19 Keeps

Throughout the pandemic there have been several areas of school life that have benefited from the changes that had been implemented and we have chosen to keep some of these changes which are listed below:

- PE kit to be worn to school on PE Days
- Lunchtime groupings
- Playground groups

Living in a World with Covid-19

Although we are now returning to a more normal way of life, Covid-19 still poses a risk to everyone and we have to take careful steps in school to ensure we keep everyone as safe as possible. In school we are continuing to:

- Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19

Masks

As a school we are asking all parents to continue wearing a face covering when they:

- Attend an in school event
- Drop off/collect children from the playground



Although, we can't make anyone wear a face covering, we do encourage everyone to do this in order to help us minimise the spread of the virus. Your child's safety and the safety of our staff and community is of the utmost importance to us.

Testing

- Staff will continue to test for Covid-19 twice weekly in school.
- Children are encouraged to take a LFT (Lateral Flow Test) before returning to school in September.
- Regular LFT home testing for children is encouraged.
- Children will be sent home to have a PCR test if they display Covid-19 symptoms.
- Children must not come into school if they have Covid-19 Symptoms. They must get a PCR test and can return once a negative test is received

Self-Isolation

The rules on self-isolation for children in primary schools has changed a little and is outlined below:

- You must self-isolate for 10 days if you have Covid-19 (positive PCR test)
- Children identified as a close contact, by NHS Track and Trace, must get a PCR test but can come into school whilst waiting on the result
- Siblings **do not** have to self-isolate unless they test positive on their PCR or develop Covid-19 symptoms

Confirmed Covid-19 Cases

You will only be informed of a positive Covid-19 case in school if your child has been in close contact with the individual. The NHS are now carrying out all track and trace for schools and they are responsible for letting you know.

The school will inform you if there is a Covid-19 outbreak in the school. An outbreak is identified as, if, within the school, a group of people, who have been in close contact, test positive within 10 days. If this happens, you will be immediately informed and the following safety measures will be reintroduced for a period of time.

- Masks will be worn by all staff and parents on site in shared areas
- Bubbles will be reintroduced
- Educational visits will stop
- One way systems will be reintroduced
- Reduce parents coming into school

In extreme cases and only as a last resort, will attendance restrictions be introduced for large groups of children

Covid-19 Symptoms

Covid-19 symptoms to look out for are:

- A persistent cough
- A high temperature
- Loss of taste or smell

If your child has any of these symptoms they **must not** come into school and must get a PCR test immediately. If the PCR is negative your child is welcome back into school.

If the PCR test is positive your child will self-isolate for 10 days and be asked to do their learning remotely and through DB Primary.

If your child has Covid-19 Symptoms and you don't take them for a PCR test, they will not be allowed in school. They will need to self-isolate for 10 days and will be expected to do their learning remotely and through DB Primary.

The School Day

Dartford Avenue gate is the entrance and exit for Robin Hall Nursery.

Nursery parents are asked to take their children to their classrooms.
