Outline of the day

8.45-55 to come in to class; children start learning at 8.45.

11.30-12.30 Lunch.

3.15 end of day; pick up is at the door.

Daily mile 3 times a week alongside 1 PE session.

One music session once a week.

Forest garden session once a week.

Our day consists of learning indoor and outdoors.

If you would like to speak to the teacher please arrange a time for the **end** of the day.

Keeping Healthy and independent

- Healthy diet.
- Oral health very important; brushing teeth with an adult twice a day.
- 10-13 hours sleep every night; early bed time is very important.
- No screen time 1 hour before bed time to help them sleep.
- Independence dressing/undressing and eating.
- Following instructions.
- Express emotions clearly.

School Day on Arrival



- ❖ Please try to keep to the dropping off and collecting times. Children arriving late or being collected late can become distressed. Always phone us if you are running late so that we are able to reassure your child that you are on your way.
- *Children must be collected by a known adult or senior school age child, not a primary aged child. If for any reason a different person is collecting your child, please let the class teacher or a member of the office staff know.





Fruit / Water



- Children are provided with a piece of fruit or vegetable every morning as part of the National Fruit Scheme, to support healthy eating.
- We actively encourage children to drink water throughout the day to keep them hydrated. Please send your child in with their own water bottle everyday and make sure it is labelled with their name.











Lunchtimes



- ❖ Your child can either have a school dinner or bring in a packed lunch. All children in Reception to Year 2 are entitled to a Universal Free School Meal and no payment is required.
- Fizzy drinks and sweets/chocolates are not allowed in packed lunch boxes.

Woodpecker Hall Academy is a **NUT & FISH FREE** school. Please do not include any items in lunch boxes that contain nuts or fish, such as 'Nutella', peanut butter sandwiches, tuna sandwiches or other nut/fish items.









TAPESTRY



Online Learning Journal system where staff record your child's progress and activities using tablet devices (iPads) and PCs.

Parents and carers can view their own child's journal on mobile devices and on their home computers, and can make observations of their own using a secure login system.

It creates a two-way communication between us (the EYFS team), and you (the parents and carers).









Curriculum



- ❖ The Foundation Stage curriculum is play-orientated and based on the premise that children learn from quality first hand experiences-Indoors and Outdoors
- Learning is further enhanced through 'Focus Group' work with Class Teachers and Teaching Assistants (TAs).

Forest (School) Garden

- Additional weekly outdoor sessions in our wonderful Ayse's garden to learn practical skills; become more independent and explore trees, plants, leaves, sticks, insects and mud.
- ❖ We kindly ask that your child has a pair of wellies and a hooded jacket at school on days they attend Forest Garden (the class teachers will inform you of that).











Medical needs



- ❖ We need to know if your child has a **medical need or allergies** which might affect them in school.
- If your child uses an inhaler, we can supervise its use during the school day.
- Please note that medication is not administered by staff unless it is part of an emergency care plan which has been agreed by the headteacher.

Please make sure that we have an up to date contact number in case we need to get hold of you.



First Aid



- Whilst we do everything we can to make sure that they are safe, children do fall over and getting the occasional bruise is part of growing up!
- Our staff are trained to attend to the children and will treat all bumps and bruises.
- If a child has bumped their head they will have a note and you will receive a call from a member of staff to make you aware.
- ❖ The children in YN-Y2 will also wear a green coloured sticker/wrist band as a visual reminder that they have been to the medical room.



How to support?



- * Read with or to your child every day, and complete the orange reading record.
- ❖ <u>Talk</u> to your child about their school day. Discuss things that they see around them and extend their vocabulary.
- ❖ Make a commitment to <u>attend</u> Parents' Evenings and Open Days, coffee mornings and workshops.
- ❖ If there are concerns over your child's behaviour or how they settle in, work with the school and support class teacher by providing consistent messages between school and home.
- ❖ Make sure your child has good <u>attendance</u> and <u>punctuality</u> by establishing good <u>routines</u> at home e.g. bedtimes.
- ❖ Homework: Weekly homework will be sent home to be completed: either literacy or maths based. Each half term a project homework will be sent home to be completed.
