### Place value

-Counting forwards and backwards up to 1 million

-Read and write numbers up to 1million and know the value of each digit and order and compare numbers up to 1 million Addition and subtraction

Add and subtract numbers mentally.

-Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits using column method. -Use rounding to check answers to calculations and determine accuracy.

### Multiplication and Division

A letter will be sent when it is your child's class's turn (on the website)






Goggles may be worn only if a letter has been sent by parent/guardian
