Maths



This half term the children will continue to work on numbers up to 100 by revisiting adding and subtracting 1- and 2-digit numbers. Using these skills they will develop their problem solving skills to solve missing number questions and use the vocabulary more than, less than and equal to. They will learn explore counting in 5 and consolidate counting in 2s and 10s.
